

# HOW TO CHOOSE YOUR SCHOOL'S SLO LEAD\*

In response to teacher and school leader feedback, ARE is asking each school to designate an SLO lead that will serve as the point of contact and training for their school in supporting the SLO process. This is to ensure that school leaders *as well as* the SLO lead receive all SLO information in a timely fashion and are able to adequately support the rest of the school staff in SLO implementation.

## CONSIDER

- The appropriate SLO lead for your building may be a leader on the school ILT, such as a team lead, team specialist, assistant principal, or dean of instruction.
- This person should be able to support teachers through the instructional aspects of the SLO process, not just the accountability aspects.
- The SLO lead must attend a minimum of three 90-minute SLO-specific trainings, in September, October and March (exact dates to follow).
- The SLO lead will be in direct contact with the Assessment Resource and Support team throughout the school year.
  - In Illuminate DnA schools, you may want to consider the SLO lead be your interim SAL, as they will already be working with the Assessment Resource and Support team.

## PROCESS

1. With your ILT, determine the best SLO lead for your school.
2. Inform your SLO lead of their selection and the above expectations.
3. Designate your SLO lead using the SAL Designation Tool by August 10, 2016.

\*It is the expectation that the school leader is the *primary* SLO lead for each school. The secondary SLO lead is designated by the school leader to support the SLO process and training.
